The official definition of a closed-loop voyage is one that originates and ends in the United States. Though it can visit contiguous territories or islands that are adjacent to the continental US at any time. It's important to note; however, that for a cruise to be "closed-loop", it must begin and end in the same port. Leaving from the east coast and returning to the west coast would not meet those requirements.
